

Processional Hymn: Jesus Christ is Risen Today - 85

### Rite of Sprinkling Holy Water - Vidi Aquam

*Having blessed the water, the Priest, vested in a cope of the colour of the day, proceeds to the altar. And there, kneeling with the other Sacred Ministers at the steps, he receives the aspergillum from one of the Ministers or servers, and first sprinkles the altar three times, then he blesses himself and, standing up, blesses the Ministers and servers as he or the cantor begins the antiphon.*

*Having sprinkled the People, the Priest returns to the foot of the altar and with hands joined continues:*

People: And let my cry come  
unto thee.

People: And with thy spirit.

### Collect

Almighty God, who through thine Only Begotten Son Jesus Christ hast overcome death, and opened unto us the gate of everlasting life: we humbly beseech thee; that as by thy special grace thou dost put into our minds good desires, so by thy continual help we may bring the same to good effect; through the same Jesus Christ thy Son, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

**First Reading** *Acts 10:34a, 37-43*

In those days: Peter opened his mouth and said: “You know the word which was proclaimed throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism which John preached: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all that were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. And we are witnesses to all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and made him manifest; not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. And he commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that he is the one ordained by God to be judge of the living and the dead. To him all the prophets bear witness that every one who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.”

**Gradual** *Haec dies (Ps 118:24,1)*

This is the day which the Lord hath made: we will be joyful and glad in it.

℣. O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is gracious: and his mercy endureth for ever.

**Responsorial Psalm** *Ps. 118:1-24*

℣. This is the day which the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; His mercy endures forever! Let Israel say, “His mercy endures forever.” ℣

The right hand of the Lord does valiantly! The right hand of the Lord is exalted; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly! I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord.

**Second Reading** *Colossians 3:1-4*

Brethren: If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

**Gospel** *John 20:1-9*

On the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. So she ran, and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Peter then came out with the other disciple, and they went toward the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first; and stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; he saw the linen cloths lying, and the napkin, which had been on his head, not lying with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not know the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

**Preface of Easter**

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God; but chiefly are we bound to praise thee for the glorious Resurrection of thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the very Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world; who by his death hath destroyed death, and by his rising to life again hath won for us everlasting life. Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; ever more praising thee, and saying:
