All holy Patriarchs and Prophets; Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors and Virgins; and the blessed Company of Heaven, **Pray for us.**

Remember not, Lord, our offences, nor the offences of our forefathers. Spare us, good Lord, spare thy people, whom thou hast redeemed with thy most precious blood, (and be not angry with us for ever.)

Collect

First Reading *Isaiah 2:1-5*

The word which Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. Second Reading *Romans 13:11-14a*

Brethren: You know what hour it is, how it is full time now for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed; the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord, Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh.

Therefore, you also must be ready; for the Son of man is coming at an hour you do not expect."

On the First Sunday of Advent, the father of the family prays before the wreath saying:

He then continues for each of the days of the first week of Advent:

O Lord, stir up thy might, we beg thee, and come, that by thy protection we may deserve to be rescued from the threatening dangers of our sins and saved by thy deliverance; who livest and reignest forever. Amen

The youngest child then lights one purple candle.
