My little children, I am writing this to you so that you may not sin; but if any one does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the expiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. And by this we may be sure that we know him, if we keep his commandments. He who says "I know him" but disobeys his commandments is a liar, and the truth is not in him; but whoever keeps his word, in him truly love for God is perfected.

Liturgical Consideration - The Sprinkling Rite

During the Seasons of Lent and Easter, we have elected to use the sprinkling rite at the beginning of our Solemn Morning Mass. The *Vidi Aquam* is used during Paschaltide and the *Asperges* chant is used outside of Paschaltide. Beginning at the altar, the sprinkling blesses the place where the Sacrament is to be consecrated so that "the demons may be prevented from drawing near." (*Durandus*) The Christian Faithful are then sprinkled precisely because, as a sacramental, the water protects us as we enter the Holy Sacrifice from the temptations of the lurking demons.

The *Vidi Aquam* gives special honor to the resurrection. The verses are taken from the prophet Ezekiel, who saw the city of God built upon the mountain top. The waters are seen coming from the side of the temple prefiguring the waters of baptism coming from the side of the crucified Christ.
